Past Perfect

When do you use the PAST PERFECT?

 Easy! if you are telling something that happened BUT you want to referred that one thing happened FIRST than the other action, you have to use the past perfect.

Examples:

- I found out that the school had cancelled the classes for tomorrow
- I heard the government had cancelled the classes for two weeks
- We also use the past perfect when something Started in the past and continued up to another Action or time in the past.

This means that the past perfect can tells us 'how long' the first action happened.

LOOK THAT

First: the school cancelled the classes

Second: you found out about that

On the second example

First: the government cancelled for two

weeks

Second: you heard about the

information

Examples:

- when he graduated, he had been in London for six years
- On the 20th of July, I had worked for three months

He had been in London for six

WHEN

He got graduated

3. The past perfect when we are going to talk about unreal or imaginary situations in the past. This is common in the third conditional and after the verb 'wish'

Examples:

- If I had known you were ill, I would have visited you.
- She would have passed the exam if she had studied harder.
- I wish I hadn't gone to bed so late!

So, let's review...

The past perfect is used to refer that one action happened first than the other BUT both are in PAST

It also tells you how long this first action took place in the past It can be used to express unreal situations with possible results in the past.

Negative sentences

Examples: I had not (hadn't) driven a car before the accident.

She hadn't eaten in that restaurant before today.

Questions

Examples: had you had time to rehearse your song?

Had she eaten there before?
